Are the worldviews that people hold to in our world today merely philosophical speculations with no right or wrong answer?

What do we mean when we use the word evil? Why are those things evil to begin with? You have to know what evil is before you can discuss it and point to examples of it. Where is the standard of good that makes this notion of evil to be intelligible?
